Fisher Notes: Immediately after the death of John Fisher of Chichester in early 1701, Thomas Robinson was cowarrantee with Thomas Fisher for 300 acres of land in Kennett, Chester County. John may have been an Irish uncle of Thomas Fisher of Kennett, but also could have been the one who married Barbara Monckton at Embleton near Pardshaw, Cumberland in 1699. Francis Chadsey (above) and Isaac Few (son of Richard Few above) both became uncles of Elizabeth Huntley Fisher, wife of Thomas Fisher of Chester County. George Fisher (above), who apparently died or left before filing any deed for his lot in Chester, was possibly the one who came from Cork in Ireland in 1685 (probable relative of Joseph Fisher of Dublin County and Philadelphia,) or the one born in Portsmouth, England in 1667, son of Denis & Susannah Fisher of Salem, New Jersey across the river. In 1695 Elizabeth Andros (Andrews), widow of George Andros (above), was represented by William Fisher (identity unknown) when she moved northward to Thornbury and bought a lot there. Thomas Fisher and Elizabeth Huntley were married in May of 1713 at the Concord Monthly Meeting of the Quakers, about 7 miles from the Chester waterfront shown here.
